This is precisely what the current London Design Biennale (LDB) aims to showcase! Under the theme "The Global Game: Remapping Collaborations," the London Design Biennale 2023 will demonstrate how designers from around the world can contribute to a better and fairer world. Key elements include working together, embracing different perspectives, listening to each other, and sharing knowledge.

"The era of globalization as we've known it is transforming into a new condition that we can't yet define. What we know for sure, however, is that in confronting our ever-growing planetary challenges, working together is more critical than ever—and we hope this biennale can act as a testing ground for examining new possibilities for doing so." said Aric Chen, General and Artistic Director of Het Nieuwe Instituut and the LDB 2023.

The DESIGN CAMPUS fully embraces this collective approach, bringing together peers through various projects and forging a network with like-minded individuals to ensure that our community benefits from the potential of collaborative design.

We are thrilled to announce our participation in the London Design Biennale 2023 with BROT: Baking Futures, a project curated by Thomas A. 
DESIGN CAMPUS x London Design Biennale 2023 - Brot : Baking the Future


Alumni Weekend in Pillnitz




